And it came to pass as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the children of Israel, that they looked toward the <u>wilderness</u> and behold the glory of the Lord <u>appeared</u> in the <u>cloud</u>.

a) <u>wilderness</u> - #4057 sense of driving; pasture; desert b) <u>appeared</u> - #7200 gaze; look upon c) cloud - #6051 covering the sky
